#### **Community Feedback:**

The Blue Line Extension project team delivered a presentation covering current design updates, workforce development efforts, cultural placekeeping, and recent DREAM sessions. Following the presentation, staff facilitated Q&A and one-on-one discussions using corridor-wide roll plots and informational posters arranged in an open-house walk-around format.

Attendance was around 21 people, with approximately 15 people joining at the beginning and about 6 more joining as the meeting progressed. Presentations were delivered smoothly and generally received with acceptance. Most attendees had minimal or no questions.

One attendee participated as a spokesperson for a nearby affected neighborhood. He took three comment cards and expressed concerns about the project timeline, perceived slow progress, and dissatisfaction with the proposed route location.

### Feedback Themes:

- Minneapolis North 10<sup>th</sup> Avenue Community Concerns
  - Petition with 600+ signatures requesting an alternate alignment along I-94
  - o Perception that the community has not been adequately consulted
- Timeline
  - o Anticipation of slow advancement
  - Requests for clearer milestones and visible indicators of progress
- Transparency
  - o Desire for full visibility on upcoming work on 7th, 8th, and 9th Streets
  - Concern that not showing this work creates an inaccurate understanding of project impacts
- Property Impacts
  - Structural risk concerns
  - o Anticipated disruptions, including additional Xcel Energy work in the North Loop
- Budget

- o Questions about when the construction budget will be finalized
- o Comments about the timeline and the budget changing as time goes

# **General Observations:**

- Reception to the presentations was generally neutral to positive.
- The only significant concerns came from the neighborhood representative noted above.
